

How did your state representatives vote on bills that impact equity, diversity, and separation of church and state?

Citizens Project monitors and takes position on legislation that impacts equity, diversity, and separation of church and state. In 2019 Citizens Project took positions on 17 bills in the Colorado General Assembly. This report card identifies how each state legislator from El Paso County voted on those bills. SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE

Citizens Project OPPOSES this bill.

HB 19-1140: Live and Let Live Act

Would create government protections for sincerely held religious beliefs or moral convictions for people, religious organizations, and private associations, and allow public and private businesses to refuse service to LGBTQ people based on the owner's religious belief.

OUTCOME: Lost in House Committee on State, Veterans, and Military Affairs

HUMAN SEXUALITY

Citizens Project SUPPORTS these bills.

HB 19-1129: Prohibit Conversion Therapy for A Minor

Prohibits a licensed mental health care provider from engaging in conversion therapy with a minor patient to attempt to change an individual's sexual orientation or gender expression.

OUTCOME: Passed

HB 19-1032: Comprehensive Human Sexuality Education

If a school district offers human sexuality instruction, it must be comprehensive to include contraception, consent, and pregnancy outcome options, and cannot exclude the health needs of LGBT individuals.

OUTCOME: Passed

HB 19-1039: Identity Documents for Transgender Persons

Makes gender identification document change easier, replaces birth certificate rather than amending it, eliminates requirement for court order for name change, and provides courts jurisdiction to issue decree to amend out-of-state birth certificates.

OUTCOME: Passed

ELECTIONS

Citizens Project SUPPORTS these bills.

HB 19-1108: Nonresident Electors and Special Districts

Allows nonresidents who own property in a special district to vote in that district's elections.

OUTCOME: Lost in Senate Committee on State, Veterans, & Military Affairs

HB 19-1266: Restore Voting Rights Parolees

An individual serving a sentence of parole is eligible to register to vote and to vote in any election, is to be given information regarding voting, and is to be automatically registered to vote.

OUTCOME: Passed

HB 19-1278: Modifications To Uniform Election Code

Revises Election Code to, among other things, allow registered 17-year-olds who will be 18 on Election Day to vote in a primary and participate in a caucus, and eliminates the requirement that petition circulators be state residents.

OUTCOME: Passed

SB 19-202: Voting Rights for Voters With Disabilities

Requires procedures and mechanisms that allow voters with disabilities to participate independently and privately in mail elections.

OUTCOME: Passed

EQUITY

Citizens Project OPPOSES this bill.

HB 19-1081: Respondent Rights Discrimination Complaints

Gives individuals under investigation for civil rights discrimination complaints the right to a publicly-funded attorney and requires the state to pay attorney fees if the individual wins in court.

OUTCOME: Lost in House Committee on State, Veterans, & Military Affairs
